Dr. Stuart G. Davis passed away Saturday, 30 July, at the University Hospital.

His association with this department began in 1935. He was awarded a B.Sc. (Chem Eng) in 1939 and he earned the M.Sc. in Chemistry in 1940. Two years later he obtained his Ph.D. in physical chemistry, at McGill.

He taught here from 1942 until his retirement in 1982.

Dr. Davis is best known for his service as Associate Chairman, from 1959 to 1982, attending to myriad administrative details involving undergraduate and graduate students, the chemistry courses, and working with other Departments and Faculties.

After retirement, he continued participating in departmental golf and curling activities.

He was best known outside the University for his philanthropy. Dr. Davis provided the lion's share of the funding for the Stuart and Winona Davis Concert Organ at the Winspear Centre - the largest organ in Canada. This was done in memory of his wife, Nona, who passed away in 1994. Most recently, he was chosen for a Distinguished Alumni Award, for 2005.
