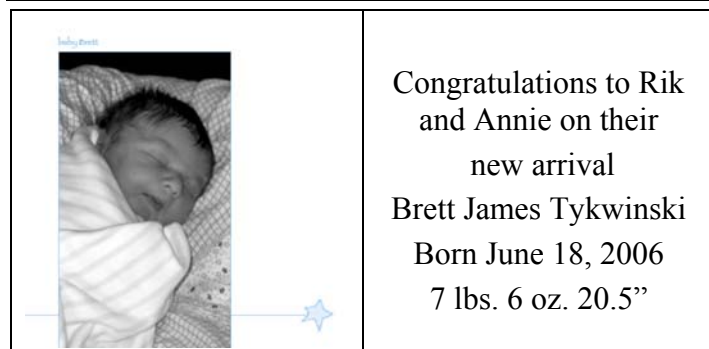


The University will be closed on Monday, July 3 for the July long weekend. ENJOY!!!
